

# Hunting Gear Checklist

## Weapons, ammo and hunting aids

- Firearm/ammunition/scope
- Bow/arrows
- Game calls
- Orange flagging ribbon – to mark trail and location of kill
- Binoculars

## Food and water

- At least two quarts of water
- Food for at least one day
- Water filter and/or water purification tablets

## Navigation

- Maps
- Compass
- GPS

## Signaling

- Whistle
- Small mirror
- Cell phone

## Emergencies

- First aid kit
- Cash – at least \$20
- Toilet paper

## Communication

- Camera/cell phone
- Pen/paper
- Walkie Talkie

## Unexpected night in the field

- Emergency blanket
- Fire – waterproof matches, lighter, candle
- Flashlight/headlamp and extra batteries

## **Camping**

- Shelter – tarp, tent, camper
- Lightweight sleeping bag
- Warm clothes
- Camp stove
- Food and water
- Firewood
- Coolers
- Hunting Knives
- Flashlights
- Cast Iron
- ATV
- Cutting Board
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## **Clothing for all weather**

- Layer 1 – Base layer
  - Layer next to the skin. Avoid synthetic material for this layer
- Layer 2 – Active Layer
  - This layer should consist of lighter and insulated pieces of clothing. Something you can take off or on depending on the temperature
- Layer 3 – Insulation Layer
  - This layer is important if you are hunting in colder environments. This layer is best with wool, synthetic or down materials which will keep you insulated.
- Layer 4 – Outer/Waterproof Layer
  - If it will rain, be sure to pack a waterproof layer that is completely waterproof but lighter.
- Other essentials:
  - Gloves
  - Hats
  - Neck Gear
  - Socks
